Safeguarding at Park Lane School



At Park Lane school we take the safeguarding of all pupils very seriously. Safeguarding and the welfare of children is everyone's responsibility. Everyone who comes into contact with children and their families and carers has a role to play in safeguarding children.

A copy of our safeguarding policy is available on the school website. This has been written under the guidance of CwmTaf Safeguarding board.

There are set procedures that as a school we must follow if any concern is raised about the safety or wellbeing of a child.

When staff have concerns about a child, concerns are logged using a safe and secure online tool called 'my Concern'. Schools across the authority use this package to record, manage and report concerns.

Our procedures are in place to ensure your child's needs are met and to make sure that if there are any change in circumstances, some extra help and support is accessible.

We work in partnership with you to ensure the child's best interest are met.

All concerns are dealt with as a matter of priority. In some circumstances it may not be possible to speak with you before contacting CwmTaf Safeguarding team.

- Accept that the school must prioritise the safety and well-being of our children
